

Art/ DT

We will be looking at Native American Art- Totem Poles. Children will use collage skills to create a section of the pole.

We will also be looking at Corey Barksdale and producing a portrait in a similar style.

In DT, we will be creating a souvenir that has a moving part on it that entertains the buyer.

Computing

Systems - In this unit, learners will develop their understanding of computer systems and how information is transferred between systems and devices.

Videoing – In this unit, learners will develop the skills to produce and edit a short video with a range of shots and production skills.

PSHE

Rights, rules and responsibilities - Children will look at Freedom of thought and speech. They will also look at rights and responsibilities and follow rules.

Emotions – Children will spend time recognising and naming emotions and thinking about ways to manage feelings.

PE

Tag Rugby – Children will practise ball handling and dynamic running skills .

Dance– Children will learn about rhythm, tempo and beat. They will create their own dance pieces.

Music

Preparation for Young Voices, the children will be learning the music, songs and dances.

RE

Words of Wisdom - Children will be looking at how different religions see the world and treat different genders. We will compare, comment and analyse before drawing on our own beliefs and thoughts.

Whose world is it? – Children will make connections between different beliefs and practises in religions. Think about the value of belonging to a faith community.

French

Phonics - In this unit, learners will develop their understanding of pronunciation in French.

The Date – Learners will read, write and say the date in French.

Autumn Term



Maths

Number and Place Value

Children will be consolidating their understanding of number, looking at the value of each digit, counting in multiples of 10, 100 and 1000 as well as ordering and comparing up to 6 digit numbers.

Four Operations

Children will be developing their knowledge and application of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They will be applying this to a range of problems as well as reasoning

Fractions

To find equivalent fractions, ordering and comparing fractions as well as adding and subtracting fractions.

Reasoning

Children will be given many opportunities to explain how they know an answer is right or where they have gone wrong when an answer is incorrect. Within each unit children will be given opportunities to complete a range of problem solving activities.

Science

Living things including animals - We will be looking at the life cycles of different animals and comparing life expectancy with gestation periods. We will also be looking at how plants reproduce.

Earth and space – Children will be able to explain the movement of Earth and the Moon in space as well as the reason for day and night and the phases of the moon.

Geography

Name and locate counties and cities of North and South America, geographical regions and their identifying human and physical characteristics, key topographical features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers), and land-use patterns; and understand how some of these aspects have changed over time.

English

Matchbox Diaries-

Descriptive Writing – Using Figurative Language to describe objects. Focus on similes, metaphors and personification.

Informal Letter Writing

We will be looking at the book 'Matchbox Diaries'. Children will build up to writing an informal letter to a family member. There will be a focus on using informal language and apostrophes for contractions, as well as paragraphs.

Setting Descriptions

Continuing on Matchbox Diaries, children will build up to use description to describe a setting.

Diary Entries

Children will write in the role of a person aboard the ship from Italy to America, using informal styles and use of first person.

Newspaper Articles - Survivor Stories

We will be writing an article about one of our Survivor stories developing our use of direct and in direct speech and including the key features of journalistic writing.
